## **ORDER OF THE EASTERN STAR**

The Order of the Eastern Star, which comes under the umbrella of the Masonic family, held its Nineteenth Biennial Session in Cairns during the first week of June 2024. It is a major event held every second year by the Grand Chapter of Australia, comprising of business meetings and on the final day the Installation of the Most Worthy Grand Matron and Most Worthy Grand Patron of Australia.

The Cairns Chapter of the OES, which meets at the Gordonvale Masonic Centre on the morning of the second Saturday of each month, was honoured for this major OES event being held in Cairns for the very first time.

The event, which was held at the Cairns Colonial Club Resort, commenced on 3 June with various committee meetings and a meeting of Grand Representatives. This was followed on 6 and 7 June with the business part of the agenda, which was open to all OES members and a banquet dinner being held on the evening of 6 June.

The main event, which was open to the public, took place on the afternoon of Saturday, 8 June with a Flag Ceremony commencing at 1.30pm with over 250 people being present with all states of Australia being represented and some 20 visitors from United States of America and Canada. The programme commenced with the entry of the Grand Master of the United Grand Lodge of Queensland, MW Bro Jeffrey Robert Harper AFSM accompanied by his wife and heads of other Masonic Orders

The Flag Ceremony was a wonderful and most colorful event with the flags of Australia, United States of America, Scotland, England, Canada and New Zealand being paraded into the meeting one at a time with brief details being given for each of the flags and the Anthems of each country being sung. This was then followed by the flags for each of the States of Australia being paraded in with lyrics from "I am Australian" being sung and after each flag, the chorus: "We are one,

but we are many and from all the lands we come, we share a dream and sing with one voice: I am, you are, we are Australian".

The Installation and Investiture of the Most Worthy Grand Matron of Australia, Sister Barbara Hartman and Most Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Ronald Aimer then followed in what was a most impressive and moving ceremony full of pomp and tradition. The investiture of

The Installation Ceremony was exceptionally well performed by the out-going Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Robyn Reily, who was ably assisted by her Worthy Grand Team of Officers, including the out-going Most Worthy Grand Parton, Brother Jonathan Nantes. The Day ended with a most entertaining banquet dinner.

The principles, ideals and values of the Order of the Eastern Star are the same as Freemasonry. It is an order that is committed to sharing, learning and community service. Mentioned at the event on Saturday, 8 June were the many charities that the Grand Chapter of Australia has assisted over the past year.

The head or chief office bearer of a Chapter of OES is the Worthy Matron with the Worthy Patron as her supporter. The meetings and festive activities following the meetings are similar to the Masonic Lodge meetings, with this difference, however, that ladies and their husbands or partners are able to take part in the activities together.

The principle stories and lessons of the Order of the Eastern Star center around the floral centre of the Chapter. The five points of the Star that can be seen in the accompanying photos, are endowed with beauty and instruction and symbolize the sublime virtues illustrated in the lives of the heroines of the Order. The blue ray of Adah symbolizes fidelity, the yellow ray of Ruth symbolizes constancy, the white ray of Esther symbolizes light, purity and joy, the green ray of Marth symbolizes hope and immortality and the red ray of Electa symbolizes Fervency.

As with Freemasonry and similar organisations the world over, the Order of the Eastern Star has experienced declining membership. At one stage there
